- Note that the organisers of the 23rd International Conference on Production Research will charge a compulsory subsistence fee of US\$40 for attending the Early Career Researchers Programme. (Payment will be made on the first day of the workshop in cash.)
- The Early Career Researchers Programme is only accessible for those that have completed their doctoral degree between 0 and 36 months before the first day of the official conference.
- Note that there will be a limited number of places available on this programme (max. 24). Those that have attended the doctoral workshops of the International Foundation for Production Research (and are included in the official registry) are prioritised above other potential candidates.
- For the session ‘Meet the Board Event’ (Monday 3rd August, 2015) you have to prepare a poster about your research interests (that could be a research project or the wider scope of research activities you are undertaking or involved in). This presentation should cover your research project for the doctoral study but not necessarily the contents of the paper you are presenting during the conference. The size of the poster is max. A0.
- To receive a certificate, you are expected to attend all sessions. The organisers of the ICPR-23 will ensure that the presentation of a paper will not coincide with attendance to the Early Career Researchers Programme.
